With great limestone peaks and deep valleys, we travel over no fewer than 19 viaducts and through 12 tunnels on this masterpiece of Victorian engineering - including the famous Ribblehead Viaduct. Our train heads into the Yorkshire Dales for a spectacular journey over the magnificent high Pennines. The sheer scale of the scenery is apparent as we pass such famous landmarks as Batty Moss, Wild Boar Fell and Mallerstang Edge, with views of the three peaks towering over the line. One magnificent sight follows another before we gradually descend into the tranquil Eden Valley and return over the west coast route through Penrith, climbing over Shap summit and through the pretty Lune Gorge affording stunning views of the Cumbrian mountains.

We are delighted to present a three-day weekend break to the Highlands of Scotland at this most dramatic and beautiful time of year – The journey will be over the entire length of the world-famous West Highland line, featuring some of the most spectacular scenery in Scotland

Crossing magnificent bridges and viaducts our train climbs high into the mountains offering views of tumbling waterfalls, peaceful lochs, and the prospect of snow-covered mountains as they glisten in winter sunlight.

HOTELS

No overnight accommodation is included allowing you the freedom and flexibility to arrange your own hotels in Fort William. For further advise and a list of recommended hotels please contact our office.

MOBILITY

This tour is not suitable for guests requiring the use of a wheelchair or with severe mobility issues as the platforms at some remote stations in the highlands are much shorter than our train, low, or accessible only by a footbridge or steps.

SATURDAY

Our train travels north with splendid views of either the Northumberland coast or Lakeland Fells before crossing the border, continuing through the Scottish Lowlands to Glasgow and along the banks of the River Clyde, where we join the scenic and spectacular West Highland line. Passing Loch Long and Loch Lomond we climb high into the mountains for a memorable journey over the wild expanse of Rannoch Moor with an arrival into Fort William around 20.30.

SUNDAY

'The Statesman' departs from Fort William at 09.00 for the magnificent 84-mile round trip to Mallaig - Passing Ben Nevis we travel along the shoreline of Loch Eil and at Glenfinnan cross the viaduct featured in the 'Harry Potter' movies offering stunning vistas down Loch Shiel and regarded by many as the most spectacular view in Britain. There will be a short break in the pretty fishing port of Mallaig before retracing our outward route passing the white sands of Morar with an arrival back in Fort William about 14.00 with the remainder of the afternoon at leisure for sightseeing

MONDAY

Departing Fort William around 09.00 we travel up the Great Glen, passing the falls of Orchy and through Monessie Gorge, then alongside Loch Treig with stunning views of the Nevis Range and Mamore Mountains. A stop (weather permitting) will be made at the isolated station at Rannoch for a short photographic break with views of the snow-covered mountains - continuing homeward around the Horseshoe Curve and County March summit.

We travel past historic York and along the East Coast route to Middlesbrough, and into vast open moorland, meandering through the magnificent forests and dales of the North Yorkshire Moors National Park with its picturesque villages of honey sandstone, embattled castles & historic abbeys which has become famous as the setting for the TV drama 'Heartbeat' - to the ancient fishing town of Whitby, where around two hours will be available at your leisure.

The Esk Valley line is one of the hidden gems of the railway network. It offers a succession of constant surprises and stunning views. Passing Sleights and Ruswarp to the beautiful fishing port of Whitby with its narrow-cobbled streets, bustling harbour and intriguing curio shops selling the famous Whitby jet jewellery. During your stay consider enjoying the best fish n chips in Britain and walk it off by climbing the 199 steps that lead from the old town up to the ruins of St Hilda's Abbey dominating the skyline and inspired Bram Stoker to write his novel, Dracula.



'The Statesman' celebrated train heads into North Wales for a journey along the spectacular coastal route with sweeping sea views and climbs high into the Snowdonia National Park and up the stunningly beautiful Conwy Valley. There is the option of spending time at either the popular tourist centre of Betws-y-Coed or Blaenau Ffestiniog where we have an optional steam excursion on the famous Ffestiniog Railway

Travelling across the Cheshire plain to Chester and passing the Roman Walls we enter Wales running alongside the Irish Sea on a coastline famed for its beaches and views. At Llandudno Junction the train reverses for the spectacular journey up the beautiful Conwy Valley where a breath-taking range of scenery unfolds, from historic castles through estuary rich in wildlife, to gentle slopes that give way to majestic crags with views of tumbling waterfalls and high mountains. The high peaks of Snowdonia are on view before our train enters the imposing slate landscape of Blaenau Ffestiniog. It is here you may join our optional tour. The train returns in the late afternoon retracing our journey over the same enchanting route.

FFESTINIOG RAILWAY


Adjacent to the main line station in Blaenau Ffestiniog is the terminus of one of the Great Little Trains of Wales - the narrow gauge Ffestiniog Railway which was built in 1836 to carry slate down to the coast. Our privately chartered steam train will be waiting to take you on a return journey to Tan-y-Bwlch as it twists and turns around the mountainside offering spectacular views across

to Harlech and beyond. Seating is limited to 150 passengers so early booking is essential. Supplement: £25 per person

MOBILITY

This tour is not suitable for guests with wheelchairs or serious mobility issues as the platforms at some stations are much shorter than our train or accessible only by a footbridge and it may be necessary to walk through several carriages when boarding or alighting. It is not possible to transfer between our train and the Ffestiniog Railway in a wheelchair.





We present a day tour to Cornwall the land of myths and legends on board "The Statesman" train - with rugged coastlines and quaint fishing villages you will savour some of the most unspoilt countryside in Britain and the opportunity to visit either the county town of Truro, or maritime Falmouth, pretty St Ives, or historic Penzance.

The highlights of this tour include the twisting scenic line around the breathtaking sea wall between Dawlish and Teignmouth – views of the Dartmoor National Park – and the infamous crossing of the iconic Royal Albert Bridge spanning the River Tamar designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel.



Our next stop is St Erth where you may join the regular local service train (payable locally) on the beautiful journey around the Hayle Estuary and Carbis Bay with magnificent views of Godrevy Lighthouse and 3 miles of golden sands to visit the ancient fishing town of St Ives - considered to be the prettiest holiday resort in Britain with its beaches, quaint cobbled streets, Tate Gallery, sub-tropical gardens, and historic harbour.

The final stop for 'The Statesman' is Penzance with spectacular views of St Michaels Mount as we arrive at the most westerly station in England with the townsfolk celebrating Mazey Day. With around two hours at your leisure there is time to discover the charms of this famous Cornish port and perhaps enjoy a cream tea by the harbour or freshly made Pasty followed by a stroll along the promenade or coastal path towards Marazion.


